

**OFFICIAL MINUTES
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK, GEORGIA
REGULAR MEETING
8:30 A. M., JANUARY 3, 1990**

PRESENT: His Honor Mayor-elect Homer L. Wilson Commissioners James A. Stephens, Thomas P. Williams, Ken Tollison and Larry Credle.

OATH OF OFFICE TO NEWLY ELECTED MAYOR

His Honor Mayor Paul Warwick, Jr., as the outgoing Mayor, welcomed the large number of citizens who were assembled in front of City Hall and called upon Reverend Frank Hall of Advent Christian Church for the invocation. Mayor pro tem Stephens presented former Mayor Warwick with a Resolution, Key to the City and a gift in recognition of appreciation for his outstanding service to the City during his term of office. Thereupon, Homer L. Wilson was sworn into office as Commissioner at Large - Mayor of the City of Brunswick, the oath of office being administered by the Honorable William R. Killian, Judge of Superior Courts of the Brunswick Circuit.

PRESENTATION OF GAVEL TO MAYOR

Vel Duncan Knight, President of the Brunswick Golden Isles Chamber of Commerce, presented Mayor Wilson with a personally inscribed gavel which was received with appreciation.

The Ceremony now concluded, members of the Commission and citizens assembled in the Council room for the first meeting of 1990.

INVOCATION

The Invocation was given by Reverend Bobby Hall of Hall's Temple.

MAYOR PRO TEM

The first order of business being the election of the Mayor pro tem, Commissioner Credle moved that Commissioner Williams be elected as Mayor Pro tem. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Stephens and was unanimously carried.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Stephens moved that the minutes of December 20 and Recessed Meeting of December 27, 1989, be approved subject to the necessary corrections. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and was unanimously carried.

PUBLICITY VIDEO

Vel Knight, president of the Chamber of Commerce presented a publicity video to the Commission about Glynn County made for the Chamber of Commerce and the Economic Development Authority. Received with appreciation.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE RENEWALS

Petition received from Chau T. Phan to retail beer and wine for consumption on premises at Peking Palace, 3102 Glynn Avenue, having been approved by the Chief of Police and the City Manager, Commissioner Tollison moved that same be granted. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Credle and was unanimously carried.

REZONING APPLICATION

Larry Taylor, Deputy Director of Zoning and Development Review submitted the following zoning application:

- (1) YWCA to subdivide Old Town Lot No. 192 into two separate lots, with the granting of the following variances:
 - (A) To reduce rear yard requirements to 9.2 feet
 - (B) To reduce lot size to 3443 square feet.

Commissioner Tollison moved that variance be granted subject to a valid parking agreement between property owners. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Stephens and was unanimously carried.

TITLE III TRANSPORTATION

The Director of Community Development presented Title III Application for approval. Commissioner Credle moved approval of same. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and was unanimously carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Williams moved that the Commission hold an Executive Session to discuss a legal matter. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Stephens and was unanimously carried.

APPOINTMENT OF HARBOR MASTER

Commissioner Williams moved that appointments be tabled for later consideration. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Stephens and was unanimously carried.

FLETC RESOLUTION

Commissioner Stephens moved that a resolution be prepared for National Law Enforcement Training Week at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and was unanimously carried.
