

**OFFICIAL MINUTES
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK, GEORGIA
REGULAR MEETING
8:30 A. M., DECEMBER 5, 1990**

PRESENT: His Honor Mayor Homer L. Wilson, Commissioners James A. Stephens, Thomas P. Williams, Larry Credle and Ken Tollison.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Commissioner James A. Stephens.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Stephens moved that the minutes of November 7, Called Meeting of November 12, Called Meeting of November 16, Recessed Meeting of November 19, 1990 be approved subject to the necessary corrections. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and was unanimously carried.

DELEGATION

John M. Browning appeared before the Commission to request that dock space at the Brunswick Marina be repaired for use of City boat owners. The Commission discussed the sale of the property. No action taken.

PUBLIC HEARING

This being the date, time and place for public hearing on proposal to rezone Lot No. 6, Block L Goodyear Park Subdivision from R-9, One Family Residential District to LM Limited Medical pursuant to advertisement. Mayor Wilson recognized the number of citizens present that wished to speak in favor of or against proposed rezoning.

Deborah Chapman, Zoning Administrator of Glynn County Community Development reported that staff recommended approval of proposed rezoning. No objections thereto, Commissioner Stephens moved approval of rezoning. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Williams and was unanimously carried.

FIRE DEPARTMENT MISSION STATEMENT

Chief Stewart appeared before the Commission to request approval of the Fire Department's Mission statement and that copies be placed over all doors in the City. Commissioner Credle moved adoption of the following mission statement. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Stephens and was unanimously carried.

Our purpose is to save lives, protect property, and promote safety.

We accomplish our purpose by providing emergency medical and fire suppression services to the citizens of Brunswick and by emphasizing fire safety education.

We encourage fire-safe life styles through active involvement of citizens, government, and industry in all aspects of fire prevention and control.

We enhance the quality of life of this generation and of future generations through awareness of hazardous material and their threat to our environment.

We readily set the example by devoting time to self-improvement, community involvement, and the belief in the worth of all mankind.

FIRE DEPARTMENT PROPOSAL

Chief Lee Stewart submitted proposal for New Fire Station and Training Site for the Brunswick Fire Department. Chief Stewart gave a brief presentation on the training site and the revenue it would generate. He further stated that the New Fire Station could be built in three years with a tremendous amount of the work in-house.

Commissioner Stephens moved approval of \$20,000 for construction of the fire Training Tower and burn room for the fire Department. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Credle and was unanimously carried.
