

**OFFICIAL MINUTES
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK, GEORGIA
REGULAR MEETING
7:00 P. M., MARCH 20, 1991**

PRESENT: His Honor Mayor Homer L. Wilson, Commissioners Thomas P. Williams, Otis Herrington and Roosevelt Lawrence.

ABSENT: Commissioner James A. Stephens.

INVOCATION: The invocation was given by Commissioner Otis Herrington.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Williams moved that the minutes of March 6, 1991 be approved. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Herrington and was unanimously carried.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE RENEWAL

Petition received from Shawn Slay to retail liquors including beer and wine at Honeylove Lounge, 1807 1/2 L Street for consumption on premises, having been approved by the Chief of Police and City Manager, Commissioner Williams moved that petition be granted. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Herrington and was unanimously carried.

Petition received from Ding Mu Lai to retail beer and wine at Golden Dragon at 3102 Glynn Avenue for consumption on premises, having been approved by the Chief of Police and City Manager, Commissioner Herrington moved that petition be granted. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Lawrence and was unanimously carried.

DELEGATIONS

Mr. Wray Avera appeared before the Commission to request that the City place an option on the purchase of Babcock and Wilcox property for six months for \$100,000.00. Mr. Avera stated that the purchase price is 7,250.00, and the property would be used for a paper warehouse. Following discussion Commissioners Williams moved that the Commission take time to study property for feasibility. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Herrington. On call for the question the motion carried by vote of 3 to 0. Mayor Wilson abstaining.

Dorothy Jones appeared before the Commission to give an update of RDC Tourism. Mrs. Jones submitted brochures on tourism in the Golden Isles and showed a nine minute video of tourism in Coastal Georgia. She stated that the video on tourism will be distributed to Legislatures in Atlanta for the 1996 Olympiad. Received as information.

Cuffie Hise, Director of Mainstreet appeared before the Commission to submit the Mainstreet fiscal report. Ms. Hise updated the Commission on the Downtown Loan Pool program and the Downtown Street Scape project.
