

**OFFICIAL MINUTES
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BRNSWICK, GEORGIA
EMERGENCY CALLED MEETING
7:00 P.M., JULY 06, 2000**

PRESENT: His Honor Bradford S. Brown, Commissioners Roosevelt Lawrence, Harold E. Jennings, Jonathan Williams, and Doris A. Davis.

INVOCATION: Commissioner Harold E. Jennings gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by everyone in attendance.

Mayor Bradford Brown announced that this meeting was called to discuss the direction that the City Council needs to go in regarding Club Cache and the BoilerMaker Club. In the recent unpleasantness that occurred this past Tuesday evening and early Wednesday morning.

Mayor Brown stated that the City Attorney has some legal issues he needs to inform the City Council about in an Executive Session, before the Council actually makes a decision as to what direction the Council wants to go in at this point. Mayor Brown asked for a motion to enter into an Executive Session to deal with legal issues.

Commissioner Jennings made the motion and Commissioner Williams seconded the motion to hold an Executive Session to discuss legal issues. The motion passed.

Following the Executive Session Mayor Brown stated that the City Council met and discussed the legal side of what the City Council can do in this particular situation. It has been determined that there needs to be some further investigation as far as the incidents that occurred on Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning. And because of that he felt that the recommendation from the City Council is to temporarily suspend operation of both businesses Club Cache and the Boilermaker Club. The suspension will last until the City Police Department can conclude their investigation into what occurred on that evening. At that point and time it will be determined whether or not the licenses should be revoked on each business.

Commissioner Lawrence made the motion and Commissioner Williams seconded the motion to suspend operation of Club Cache and the Boilermaker Club, until the City Police Department conduct an investigation on what occurred at these businesses on Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning.

Mayor Brown stated that this investigation by the City Police Department will do further investigation not only with patrons of those businesses, but apparently with teenagers and young adults that were in the area and also with persons that were shooting fireworks. As to determine where the fireworks came from and how to curtail the behavior from happening in the future as far as that kind of activity because that could be dangerous.

Mayor Brown asked if there was any further discussion. There being no further discussion on call of the vote the motion passed.

Commissioner Lawrence made the motion and Commissioner Williams seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed.
