COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK, GEORGIA  
CALLED MEETING

APPROVAL (S):

Adopt Millage Rate for 2001.

Director of Finance Rick Drummond reported that the Five-year  
history and  
current 2001 tax digest values have been advertised for the  
purpose of setting a  
millage rate at today's meeting. He stated that pursuant to the  
requirements of  
O.C.G.A. 48-5-32 the city advertised the five-year history at  
least two weeks prior  
to setting of the millage rate.

Following a brief discussion Commissioner Lawrence made the  
motion and

Commissioner Jermings seconded the motion adopting the following  
resolution:

AD VALOREM TAX MILLAGE RATE RESOLUTION  
CITY OF BRUNSWICK

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of  
Brunswick, a Georgia Municipal Corporation, that an ad valorem  
tax of thirty-  
seven dollars and thirty-two (37.32) per one thousand dollars  
(\$1000.00) of  
assessed valuation is hereby levied and assessed for the calendar  
year 2001 upon  
all tangible property that is subject to taxation within the  
City. Pursuant to  
O.C.G.A. Section 48-8-91, it is further resolved that said  
millage rate of thirty-  
seven and thirty-two one hundredths (37.32) mils shall be reduced  
by twenty-six  
and thirty-two one hundredths (26.32) mils, that being the  
millage rate which, if

levied against the tangible property in the City of Brunswick,  
would produce an  
amount equal to the distribution of local option sales tax  
received by the City of  
Brunswick during 2000, leaving a net millage rate of eleven and  
zero one  
hundredths (11.0) mils, which shall be the net millage rate upon  
which each  
taxpayer's bill shall be based.

--- IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that payment of 2001 ad valorem  
taxes  
shall be due no later than January 31, 2002.

SO RESOLVED this 25th day of October 2001, upon motion  
duly made and  
seconded, by the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of  
Brunswick.
