

OFFICIAL MINUTES  
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK GEORGIA  
RESCHEDULED MEETING  
6:00 P.M., JULY 17, 2002

PRESENT: His Honor Mayor Bradford S. Brown, Commissioners Roosevelt Lawrence, Harold E. Jennings, Jonathan Williams and Doris A. Davis.

INVOCATION: Commissioner Williams gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The Pledge of Allegiance was recited in unison by everyone in attendance.

MINUTES: Regular Rescheduled meeting of July 10, 2002.

Commissioner Williams made the motion and Commissioner Davis seconded the motion approving the minutes of the regular rescheduled meeting of July 10, 2002.  
The motion passed.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE(S):

1. Alcoholic Beverage License for the Shiv Shakli Krupa, Inc., d/b/a Discount Stop #6, located at 2722 Norwich Street, to retail Distilled Spirits from the premises. Manager is Fanil C. Patel.

Captain Chris Stewart recommended approval of the issuance of an alcoholic beverage license for Shiv Shakli Krupa, Inc., Discount Stop #6.

Commissioner Williams made the motion and Commissioner Davis seconded the motion granting an alcoholic beverage license to Fanil C. Patel at Shiv Shakli Krupa, Inc., d/b/a Discount Stop #6, 2722 Norwich Street to retail distilled spirits from the premises. The motion passed.

2. Mc Garvey's Wee Pub, located at 1704 Newcastle Street, to retail distilled spirits for consumption on premises. Manager is Kevin McGarvey.

Mayor Brown reported that the above item was for discussion to possibly revise the Alcoholic Beverage License Ordinance.

City Attorney Frey reported that he could revise the Ordinance to state that if a church is in a commercial or industrial zone the minimum distance of 600 feet does not apply.

Following discussion the Commission instructed City Attorney Frey to proceed with the revision of the ordinance.

City Attorney Frey stated that he would advertise and have revision ready for the next Commission meeting.

APPROVAL(S) :

1. Request permission to execute Local Assistance of Grants Awards through the Department of Community Affairs. Roosevelt Harris, Jr. City Manager.

City Manager Harris reported that the City received two grants from the Department of Community Affairs. He stated that one grant was for \$30,000 which would be used to assist in the purchase of a new snorkel and the second grant for \$50,000 would be used for Fire Department improvements and equipment.

Following a brief discussion Commissioner Davis made a motion and Commissioner Jennings seconded the motion accepting the two grants totaling \$80,000 for purchasing a new snorkel and Fire Department improvements and equipment. The motion passed.

Commissioner Davis made the motion and Commissioner Jennings seconded the motion to accept the above monthly reports. The motion passed.

City Attorney Frey reported that the above items were discussed at the Work Session, and that there was no action to be taken at the present time.

CITY CLERK'S ITEM(S):

Petition received from Annie P. Smith for deed to lot #1, Section B-10 Palmetto Cemetery. Original deed lost, but City records verify ownership.

Commissioner Davis made a motion and Commissioner Jennings seconded the motion approving the above cemetery deed petition. The motion passed.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Mayor Brown announced that the Commission would hold an Executive Session to discuss pending litigation and personnel matters.

Following the Executive Session Commissioner Lawrence made a motion and Commissioner Davis seconded the motion adjourning the meeting.
