ORDINANCE 1027

AN ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK TO PROVIDE FOR ANNEXATION OF PROPERTY PURSUANT TO THE PETITION OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK DATED JANUARY 10, 2012; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The commission of the City of Brunswick hereby ordains:

SECTION ONE

The petition of the City of Brunswick dated January 10, 2012 seeking to have a certain parcel of land annexed into the City of Brunswick, copies of which are attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein as if fully repeated verbatim within this Ordinance, are granted and approved by the City Commission of the City of Brunswick. The parcel of real property described therein is hereby annexed into and made a part of the City of Brunswick pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 36 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, said parcel being contiguous to existing corporate limits of the City of Brunswick, as defined in O.C.G.A. § 36-36-20, and Glynn County having made no objection to said annexation.

SECTION TWO

This ordinance shall become effective for ad valorem tax purposes on December 31, 2012 and for all other purposes on January 1, 2012.

SECTION THREE

The City Planner of the City of Brunswick is instructed to file a report with the Department of Community Affairs and the governing authority of Glynn County within thirty (30) days after the last day of the quarter in which the annexation becomes effective as set forth in Section 2 that includes certified copies of this ordinance; that the ordinance was adopted pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 36 of Title 36 of the Code of Georgia; the name of the county in which the property being annexed is located; the total acreage annexed; the enactment date and effective date of the annexation ordinance; and a letter from the city stating the intent to add the annexed area to Census maps during the next survey and stating that the survey map will be completed and returned to the Census Bureau.

All of that certain lot, tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the 26th District, Glynn County, Georgia, and being more particularly described as follows, to-wit: COMMENCING at the point where the northerly line of Cypress Mill Road intersects the westerly line of Carteret Road in a northerly direction a distance of 322.91 feet to the point and place of beginning; thence north 70 degrees 23 minutes west for a distance of 141.5 feet; thence north 8 degrees 50 minutes west for a distance of 121.5 feet to a point; thence south 71 degrees 00 minutes west for a distance of 174.9 feet to said western side of Carteret Road; thence running along said western side of Carteret Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 130.05 feet to the point and place of beginning.





ORDINANCE 1031

AN ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK TO PROVIDE FOR AND CORRECT A SCRIVENER'S ERROR ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE 1027 ANNEXING 117 HARRIS FARM ROAD PURSUANT TO THE PETITION OF THE CITY OF BRUNSWICK DATED JANUARY 10, 2012; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, The City of Brunswick annexed a parcel of land, commonly known as 117 Harris Farm Road, via Ordinance 1027, adopted on December 19, 2012; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 1027 contained a scrivener's error which provided that the ordinance shall become effective "for all other purposes on January 1, 2012."

WHEREAS, the effective date "for all other purposes" should have been January 1, 2013, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-36-2(a);

THEREFORE,

That Ordinance 1027, Section Two, hereby amended as follows:

SECTION ONE

This ordinance shall become effective for ad valorem tax purposes on December 31, 2012 and for all other purposes on January 1, 2013.

SECTION TWO

This ordinance shall become effective immediately and related back, as allowed by law, to December 19, 2012.

SECTION THREE

All other parts of Ordinance 1027 remain unchanged and in effect.

SECTION FOUR

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE

It is the intention of the City Commission in adopting this ordinance that should any paragraph, phrase, clause, word or other part hereof be adjudicated invalid under state or federal law, then any remaining portions of the ordinance shall remain in effect and be enforced to the extent reasonable consistent with the purposes hereof.
