## ORDINANCE 1030

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ADMINISTRATION ORDINANCE, CODE OF CITY OF BRUNSWICK, CHAPTER 2, TO PROHIBIT A COMMISSIONER OR MAYOR FROM APPLYING FOR A POSITION OF EMPLOYMENT WITH THE CITY; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

The commission of the City of Brunswick hereby ordains that the Code of Ordinances of the City of Brunswick be and it is hereby amended as follows:

### SECTION ONE:

That the Code of Ordinances of the City of Brunswick, Georgia, is hereby amended by adding a section, article, chapter or other designation as the case may be, to be numbered Chapter 2, Article I, Section 2-27, which reads as follows:

#### **Sec. 2-27 - Employment of City Commissioners and Mayor.**

**A commissioner or mayor shall not be eligible to apply for an open position of employment with the City. However, nothing herein shall prevent a mayor or commissioner from running for the office of commissioner or mayor pursuant to the City Charter.**

### SECTION TWO:

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.


### SECTION THREE:

If any section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

### SECTION FOUR:

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption by the City Commission.

Commissioner Martin made a motion to adjourn; second by Commissioner Cason. Motion passed unanimously by a vote of 5 to 0.

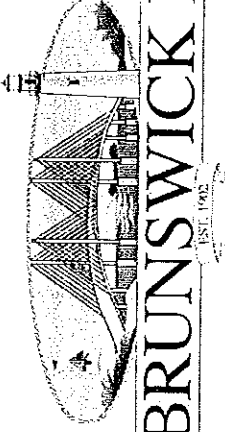

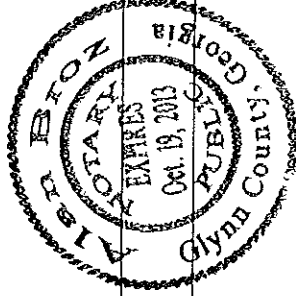
