Frequently Asked Questions

1. How do I schedule a tour of the fire station or request a fire truck to my event?

- For any inquiries regarding fire station tours, fire truck requests, or fire safety trailer requests, please contact our Administrative Assistant at 912-267-5546.

2. How do I schedule a fire inspection for my business?

- If a fire inspection is needed for the purpose of obtaining a business license, please contact City Hall at 912-267-5500 and request to speak with the Permit Technician. This is done for your convenience so that the building inspection and fire inspection are conducted in one appointment.

3. How do I obtain a fire report?

- To obtain a fire report, please contact Brunswick Fire Department Headquarters at 912-267-5546 or come to our station located at 1201 Gloucester Street.

4. How do I become a firefighter?

- So you want to become a firefighter? Our application can be found on the City of Brunswick's website by clicking the Job Opportunities link at the top of the webpage. 5. Can I have a fire in my yard?

- See Sec. 10-7 of Brunswick Code of Ordinance Below

Sec. 10-7. - Building fires in streets, vacant lots, private and public property etc.

(a) It shall be unlawful have an open burning on a sidewalk, street, public square, lane, alley, vacant lot, public property, private property, occupied lot, unoccupied lot, or other public or private yard, except as provided in subsection (b) of this section.

(b) For any open burning cooking, such as an oyster roast, barbeque, low country boil, etc., within ten feet of a sidewalk, building, structure, lot line, or other combustible materials, including, but not limited to, trees, bushes, wood piles, and other flammable liquids and materials, a resident of such property at which the open burning cooking is to occur must be granted permission from the fire marshal or his designee to conduct said cooking.

(c) Permission may be granted by the fire chief or his designee and fire department must be notified with name, address, contact information and any other relevant information the fire department may require to insure safety within the community and at said open burning cooking event.

(d) Any person who has been granted permission by the fire marshal or his designee to have an open burning cooking but fails to have such open burning properly supervised by an adult or fails to completely extinguish the open burning cooking before it is left unsupervised shall be in violation of this section of the City Code of Brunswick.
